It is an opportunity to look back on 2017, relive some of the milestones, to <u>thank God for his faithfulness and blessings for another year, and to look forward to the rest of this year</u>. An APCM is an important opportunity to report back to the church family about the various aspects of church life that not everyone might be aware of. An <u>annual report will be available</u> in advance – please take away a copy and familiarise yourself with everything that has happened.

An APCM is a chance to say <u>thank you to the many members of our church</u> who have contributed their gifts, time, talents and resources to the ministry and mission of Denham Parish Church.
