"I turn to Christ"

Baptism is the beginning of our Christian journey with Jesus. Many of us have been baptised and later respond to the promises made on our behalf when we are confirmed. Others are baptised as adults and respond to Jesus' call to follow him themselves. Here is an extract from "The Pilgrim Way: A Guide to the Christian Faith":

What does it mean to believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

To believe is to trust in the Father's love for the world, in the saving work of Jesus Christ on the cross, and in the transforming power of the Holy Spirit.

How do you become a Christian?

By turning to Jesus Christ in faith, by repenting of your sins, and being baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

What is sin?

Sin means not living according to the will of God. To sin is to fall short in our thoughts, words and deeds, through what we do and through what we fail to do. Sin separates us from God and neighbour.

What is baptism?

Baptism in water is the sacrament of new birth in Christ. We die to sin that we may live his risen life. We are washed by the Holy Spirit and become members of the Church.

What is the Church?

The Church is the pilgrim people of God, the body of Christ, and the community of disciples in every age in earth and heaven.

Would you like to explore these questions in more depth? At Café Church (first Sunday of the month, 3.30-5.00pm, St Mark's) we are exploring the meaning of baptism over the next few months – do join us.
