An Associate Minister For Our Church

Christoph Lindner writes: At our PCC meeting last week we put the finishing touches to a role description and job advert for an associate minister for Denham Parish Church.

Why do we need an Associate Minister?

As we have developed our vision and mission over the last 18 months, it has become increasingly clear that God is giving us many opportunities that we cannot grasp at present because we do not have the capacity. The church is a 'priesthood of all believers' and everyone is needed to fulfil God's mission. Thank you for the part that you play! However, there are certain tasks and opportunities that require a person who is freed up to focus on them and authorised by our church for them (i.e. ordained).

So what would he or she do?

The Associate Minister will be part of our vision to pray, welcome and share like Jesus. He or she will work closely with the Rector in sharing and developing the priestly tasks. The associate will help us develop the many opportunities we have through baptisms, weddings and funerals (for example preparation and follow-up). He or she will also take some responsibility in developing our ministry among seniors and our prayer life.

But how much will this cost us?

We are looking either for a *self-supporting minister* (no stipend and no house required) or a "*House for Duty" minister* (no stipend, but we provide accommodation). In the past our church had a training curate and a Church Army evangelist – that's what St Mark's House and St Francis House were built for! This is a great gift as we develop our team – either to house staff (as we do with Francis and Annabel Moloney) or to use the rental income to find alternative accommodation. Apart from that potential loss of rental income, there will be no major cost to us.

Please pray that God would prepare and lead us to the right person!
