Rethink:

Helping thinkers believe and believers think. Churches Together Mission, 18–25 November

When Jesus was asked, "Which is the greatest commandment?" he answered with a verse from Deuteronomy 6.5: "Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." But Jesus added a few words: "... and with all your mind."

To love God with your mind begins with being curious about God, to think about the world we live in and to ask big questions. Sometimes these big questions seem to unsettle our faith: "Has science abolished God?" "Can we really trust the Bible?" "Why does a loving God allow suffering?"

They can become a big stumbling block for people who would like to believe in Jesus. Or they can become a convenient excuse. As followers of Jesus we keep asking questions and will do until we die. The God who invites us to love him with all our mind encourages us to do that!

That's why we have called our joint mission in November "Rethink" – it's an invitation to think again about the faith. A Christian believer once said to an unbelieving friend, "Tell me about the God you do *not* believe in and you may find that I don't believe in *that* God either."

We are planning this Mission together with other churches in our area, but each local church will put on their own events. We'd love to hear your ideas – please speak to Kathy Paine or Christoph Lindner.

³³ With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; ³⁴he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples.
