Pam Clark

20th April 1931 — 14th June 2018 Although it is some years since Pam lived in Denham, many of St Mary's congregation will remember her with great respect and admiration.

The family moved from Kenton to Denham in 1963 in order to be nearer the engineering company her husband ran at Rickmansworth. They attended monthly services at St Mark's, the children enjoyed Sunday School and were also members of the Brownies and Guides. Pam was a full-time school teacher but if anything needed doing, Pam was the first to volunteer. Her organising talents were legendary.

The family moved to Chalfont St Giles in 1978 but their loyalty to Denham continued. Two of their daughters were married at St Mary's, the youngest to Adrian Roach who, until quite recently, was a relief organist here. After several years Pam and her husband returned to worship at St Mary's and in time Pam became coordinator of Denham Village Fayre, every year breaking the previous year's total. She would persuade her many friends to do a two-hour stint selling Tombola tickets while family members filled in gaps on all the church stalls. Fund-raising events for St Mary's continued throughout the year – Quizzes in the Village Hall, Beetle Drives, Old Time Music Halls and Silent Auctions. She ran Summer Holiday Clubs for Denham children and took over the leadership of the Red Cross Luncheon Club until 2005 when she moved to Towersey, a small village in Oxfordshire. There she attended St Catherine's Church, where her Memorial Service was held on 2nd July 2018. The Revd. Derek Witchell gave the address saying how greatly Pam's loyalty, dedication and extraordinary talents would be missed. It was a joyful service, meticulously planned by Pam. There is a copy of the Order of Service on the Notice Board at the back of church.

Mark 6. 14-29

¹⁴ King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, 'John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him." ¹⁵But others said, 'It is Elijah.' And others said, 'It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old.' ¹⁶But when Herod heard of it, he said, 'John, whom I beheaded, has been raised.' ¹⁷ For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. ¹⁸For John had been telling Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.' 19And Herodias had a grudge against him, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, ²⁰ for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. ²¹But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banguet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. ²²When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, 'Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it.' ²³And he solemnly swore to her, 'Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom.' ²⁴She went out and said to her mother, 'What should I ask for?' She replied, 'The head of John the baptizer.' Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, 'I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter.' ²⁶The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the quests, he did not want to refuse her. ²⁷Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, ²⁸brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. ²⁹When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.
