Seven reasons to ban the Lord's Prayer

Back in 2015 the Church of England produced a 60 second commercial with the word of the Lord's Prayer – a beautiful film. But the distributors declared it unsuitable for screening as it carried the risk of upsetting audiences. I disagree with their decision. But from the perspective of global corporations, perhaps there are very good reasons to ban the Lord's Prayer from cinemas:

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name": this prayer opposes the myth that we are random specks of fragmented humanity. Contrary to the seductions of the advertising culture, we are *not* defined by what we spend.

"Your kingdom come...": This prayer gives us courage to live in an imperfect world, to engage, not retreat from the world or anaesthetise ourselves by consuming more.

"Give us this day our daily bread": The Lord's Prayer teaches us to live with just enough. It teaches contentment, the most subversive virtue of them all.

"Forgive us our sins...": The Lord's Prayer teaches me to live with my imperfections and the imperfections of others. Grace subverts the whole culture of advertising.

"... as we forgive those who sin against us": The Lord's Prayer offers a way of reconciliation. The greatest happiness comes from reconciled relationships, not things.

"Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil": The Lord's Prayer builds resilience in the human spirit. We are not living in a Disney fairy tale; we are prepared for the bad days.

"For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen": The Lord's Prayer tells us how the story ends, how this life is to be lived and lived well.
