Alpha - Your Questions Answered

What is it? Alpha is a chance to explore life and the Christian faith in a friendly, informal environment: good food, even better conversations, talks that make you think.

Is it for me? People around the world from all backgrounds, ages and faiths have done Alpha. Their feedback shows that the vast majority have found it helpful.

But I believe in God already! Many Christians have found that Alpha has revitalised their faith. Some of us feel we cannot ask some questions because they are too 'basic'. At Alpha no question is too 'simple' or too 'difficult'.

You will help those who have a faith to reflect more deeply on it and you may find that some of your assumptions about Christianity (and Christians) aren't necessarily confirmed.

Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit. 4 Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; 5 and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; 6and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. 7To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. 8To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.
