NOT OWNED, ONLY 'LENT'

This week, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Early Christians wanted to prepare in a special way for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Day. As early as the second century many therefore observed special days of fasting. Over the next centuries that time was extended to 40 days, maybe in remembrance of Jesus fasting in the wilderness for 40 days. Lent starts on Ash Wednesday and when you do the maths, you will find that it lasts for 46 (!) days. That's because Christians thought it wasn't right to fast on Sundays, when we celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

The Letter of James reminds us that every good gift comes from our heavenly Father. But we have a tendency to worship the gifts and forget the giver.

In Lent we have the opportunity to remind ourselves that all God's gifts are *lent* to us, that we do not own them.

We do this by giving up things for 40 days – not because they are bad, but because they could become an *idol* – something or someone we worship. In our 10.30am Sunday services at St Mary's from next week we will be *unmasking the idols of love, money and power* that we are all in danger of worshipping.

What are you giving up for Lent? What new habit might you be taking up?

Tearfund are offering the booklet "Enough", a Lent devotional with a bible verse, thought and prayer for each day (pick one up at the back of church – if we run out, we will order more). Here is what the introduction of the book says:

"In God's eyes, we are more than enough. It's why he sent his son to reconcile us to him. At Lent we can take time to reflect on all he did for us. Time to reject the message that we aren't enough or need more stuff to complete us, and instead remember Christ died for us, just as we are."

Dear God, you know everything about me. Thank you that you know the very best and the very worst there is to know about me and yet you still love me. Let your acceptance of me sink deep into my heart. And help me to welcome others without judgment. Amen.


