Worshipping with our wallets By Kate Bottley

Growing up, Thursday nights were nights of fear and dread. My dad got his wages on a Thursday, in a tiny double folded piece of brown paper. After counting out the notes into little piles – the gas, the electric, the insurance, he pushed over a small pile to my mum 'for housekeeping'. Most of the time it was enough. When dad was made redundant, Mum took on three jobs so we could manage.

When I first came to faith as a teenager I suggested to my dad I might like to give some of my pocket money to the church's building project. He said 'The churches are full of gold and silver and yet they ask the people for money? Don't be a fool.' When I got married to a vicar's son who'd grown up tithing [i.e. giving ten percent of their income to the church] there was a clash of cultures.

I recently preached on tithing. Afterwards a lifelong daily worshipper in his 8os grabbed me and told me he'd never heard of such an idea and was I absolutely sure there was some biblical evidence for it.

I tend to tell the story of what changed for me when I went from being someone who didn't give to someone who did give to the church. I started to see that giving was part of my worship. No longer did it seem a functional exercise aimed at repairing the roof, this became about my relationship with God. My father-in-law (to be) talked about not the amount but the attitude being key to being a cheerful and generous giver and that if I was to give grumpily I could keep my money.

Even my dad has changed his mind although he's a little more pragmatic. 'Well, you give it away if you want, it's yours and after all there are no pockets in a shroud.'
