#### P is for Pause

In the *Prayer Course* Pete Greig spells the word P.R.A.Y. as **P**ause, **R**ejoice, **A**sk, **Y**ield. He writes about **P**ause: "To start we must stop. To move forward we must pause. This is the first step in a deeper prayer life: put down your wish-list and wait. Sit quietly. 'Be still and know that I am God' (Psalm 46.10). Become fully present in place and time so that your scattered senses can re-centre themselves on God's eternal presence. Stillness and silence prepares your mind and primes your heart to pray from a place of greater peace, faith and adoration. In fact, it is in itself an important form of prayer."
