Read the Bible in 2020 - Part 2

One of the healthy habits of Christians who want to deepen their faith is a regular rhythm of reading the Bible. Make 2020 your "Year with the Bible"!

Here are some more ideas to get you started. Go to our website, for more details www.denhamparish.church/bible-in-one-year/.

- **(1)Read 100 essential passages from scripture that's two per week.** The Essential 100 programme guides you through 50 Scripture passages from the Old Testament, and the New Testament. *Pick up a leaflet* at the back of church or go to tinyurl.com/e100-planner.
- (2) Read the Bible in one Year A popular one-year Bible programme is Bible in one Year. You can download the app or read it in a browser (www.bibleinoneyear.org). Containing passages with reflections and prayers for each day. If you prefer it in book form you can order it, ask for / search for The Bible In One Year: A Commentary by Nicky Gumbel
- (3) Use Bible Reading Notes. *New Daylight* is the most popular series, suitable for all readers. *Day by Day with God* especially for women. *Bible Reflections for Older People. Guidelines* in-depth study, drawing on current theological scholarship. *The Upper Room* all meditations are written by readers themselves. Speak to Glynis Howell to find out more or to subscribe.
- (4) A tailored reading plan for you Why not talk to another Christian or one of our ministers? Some study Bibles contain reading plans on specific topics and life situations. A study Bible is a great long-term investment we recommend the *NIV Life Application Study Bible*. The *youversion* of the **Bible** is a free app which contains a range of tailored reading plans.
- (5) Reflect deeply on a shorter Bible passage Take just one passage and then read it slowly and prayerfully, noticing where your attention is drawn. This is an ancient practice, sometimes called *lectio divinα* and 24-7 Prayer have just launched the app *Lectio* 365, which helps you do that.
- **(6) Read the Bible with others** At the heart of our lifegroup meetings is growing in faith and friendship. We read and reflect on the Bible together and are enriched by what others find. *Interested in trying α lifegroup*? Speak to other lifegroup members or one of our ministers.

Collect

Heavenly Father, at the Jordan you revealed Jesus as your Son: may we recognize him as our Lord and know ourselves to be your beloved children; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.

Post Communion

Lord of all time and eternity, you opened the heavens and revealed yourself as Father in the baptism of Jesus your beloved Son: by the power of your Spirit complete the heavenly work of our rebirth through the waters of the new creation; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Acts 10. 34-43

34 Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, 35but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ he is Lord of all. 37That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: 38 how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. 39We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, 41 not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. 42He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. 43All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

This is the word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God.**

Matthew 3. 13-end

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

13 Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. ¹⁴John would have prevented him, saying, 'I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?' ¹⁵But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfil all righteousness.' Then he consented. ¹⁶And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. ¹⁷And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. All: Praise to you, O Christ.

Up from the grave he rose again!
And as he stands in victory
Sin's curse has lost its grip on me
For I am his and he is mine —
Bought with the precious blood of Christ

No guilt in life, no fear in death This is the power of Christ in me From life's first cry to final breath Jesus commands my destiny No power of hell no scheme of man Can ever pluck me from his hand Till he returns or calls me home Here in the power of Christ I'll stand!
