“Don't let trouble overwhelm you” by Ian Jennings

Our Gospel reading begins with Jesus offering these reassuring words, “Let not your heart be troubled, trust in God always, trust also in me.” Jesus was not saying, “Don't worry there is no trouble to be concerned with.” He was really saying, “Don't let trouble overwhelm you; don't let anxiety defeat you. Fix your trust firmly in me.” He was teaching his disciples, and that includes us, that we can live with hearts that are free from trouble even in a troubled world. How we need to grasp that today. We need to unclench our hearts and open up to the glorious truth of resurrection so that we can be sign post of hope to others in these troubled times.

Jesus does not just supply the answer to our questions and provide the solution to our problems. At the deepest level he becomes the answer and the solution when we put our trust wholly in him because he is the resurrection and the life. He clearly points to himself not merely as a signpost but as the one to whom all the signposts have been pointing. “I am the Way the Truth and the Life.” Every religious leader has said, “There is the way; take that path.” Jesus was unique in saying, “I *am* the way, follow *me*.” For some it is an uncomfortable statement because he says that he is the only way to the Father. Some would rather take the view that there are many ways to the Father and that Jesus is just one of them. But Jesus did not leave us with that option.

Once when I was conducting a funeral in the crematorium I picked up the pulpit Bible and flicked open to John 14. I noticed that several verses were underlined but one was crossed out; it was “I am the way the truth and the life; no one comes to the Father except through me.” Someone clearly liked the idea of many rooms in the Father's house but not that he was the only way to the Father! But that is the deal! That's the only way we can live with trouble-free hearts in a trouble filled world. These are not sugar-coated words of sentimentality. Here is truth that can bring us into a living relationship with Father God and fill our vision with the bright light of hope.

These are troubled times and for some the days are very difficult but the closer we are to Jesus the more we will be freed from fear and filled with peace.

God's peace and presence be with you today.

Confession and Absolution

Orthodox theologian Alexander Schmemmann reminds us that sin wasn't simply that man loved the material; it was that he loved it for itself. It severed the food from God. Man ate the forbidden fruit. Not given, not blessed by God. The first sin was not only our love of the gift, it was our preference for the gift over the giver. Creation was no longer means of knowing and serving and praising God, but a means of satisfying our own greedy appetites.

Let us confess our sins to God,
who forgives us in Christ.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against you
and against our neighbour
in thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry, and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
who died for us, forgive us all that is past;
and grant that we may serve you
in newness of life to the glory of your
name. Amen.

Bible Reading:

John 14. 1-14

'Do not let your hearts be troubled.
Believe in God, believe also in me. In my
Father's house there are many dwelling-
places. If it were not so, would I have told
you that I go to prepare a place for you?
And if I go and prepare a place for you, I
will come again and will take you to
myself, so that where I am, there you
may be also. And you know the way to
the place where I am going.' Thomas said
to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you
are going. How can we know the way?'
Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the
truth, and the life. No one comes to the
Father except through me. If you know
me, you will know my Father also. From
now on you do know him and have seen
him.'

Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the
Father, and we will be satisfied.' Jesus
said to him, 'Have I been with you all this
time, Philip, and you still do not know
me? Whoever has seen me has seen the
Father. How can you say, "Show us the
Father"? Do you not believe that I am in
the Father and the Father is in me? The
words that I say to you I do not speak on
my own; but the Father who dwells in me
does his works. Believe me that I am in
the Father and the Father is in me; but if
you do not, then believe me because of
the works themselves. Very truly, I tell
you, the one who believes in me will also
do the works that I do and, in fact, will do
greater works than these, because I am
going to the Father. I will do whatever
you ask in my name, so that the Father

may be glorified in the Son. If in my
name you ask me for anything, I will do it.

This is the word of the Lord.
