# **Fire and Form** by Christoph Lindner

When the fire of the Holy Spirit fell at Pentecost, the disciples were radically changed. And not just they. Peter's preaching on that day resulted in about 3,000 baptisms - the first church was born. And very soon - in the next verse - we witness how new and appropriate forms were found for this powerful move of God: "They *devoted themselves* to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." (Acts 2:42)

#### Fire and form: we need both.

Fire without form may burn brightly for a moment but then die down quickly lots of paper and kindling, but no wood. Form without fire becomes lifeless and cold - a dead ritual: the paper, kindling and wood perfectly arranged in the grate, but no spark to light it.

On the 13th of August of 1727 a small community of Moravians in the little German village of Herrnhut experienced the fire of the Holy Spirit as they prayed and repented of their divisions. Together with their founder, Count Zinzendorf, they started a non-stop, 24-7 prayer meeting that would continue for more than 100 years. They became pioneers of the modern mission movement and took this fire to the ends of the earth. It was at a Moravian Bible study in London that John Wesley's 'heart was strangely warmed', which led to the birth of Methodism. They met weekly and found forms to help them lead a life that pleases God. That's why they were branded 'Methodists' by others, a jibe that John Wesley turned into a title of honour.

## Fire and form. Healthy habits.

At Denham Parish Church we pray for the renewing fire of God's Spirit. And this coming Sunday we are starting to explore and deepen our practice of ten healthy habits of the Christian life. We will begin with *prayer*.

### Opening Prayer (from Psalm 104)

Bless the LORD, O my soul. O LORD my God, you are very great. You are clothed with honour and majesty, wrapped in light as with a garment.

O LORD, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. When you hide your face, they are dismayed; when you take away their breath, they die and return to their dust. When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground.

I will sing to the LORD as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have being. May my meditation be pleasing to him, for I rejoice in the Lord.

# Hymn Be still, for the presence of the Lord,

the Holy One, is here; come, bow before him now, with reverence and fear. In him no sin is found, we stand on holy ground. Be still, for the presence of the Lord, the Holy One, is here.

Be still for the glory of the Lord is shining all around; he burns with holy fire, with splendour he is crowned. How awesome is the sight, our radiant King of Light! Be still, for the glory of the Lord is shining all around.

Be still, for the power of the Lord is moving in this place, he comes to cleanse and heal, to minister his grace. No work too hard for him, in faith receive from him; Be still for the power of the Lord is moving in this place.

#### Confession and Absolution

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit. (Psalm 51.10-12)

Let us confess our sins to God, who forgives us in Christ.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry, and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

May God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son to be our Saviour forgive us our sins and make us holy to serve him in the world, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

First Reading: John 20 19 - 23 When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

Second Reading: Acts 2. 41-47

Those who believed what Peter said were baptised and added to the church that day—about 3,000 in all. All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer.

A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. They worshipped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity— all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.
