

A 9.30 am service from 2 August

From next Sunday onwards there will be a short 9.30am service at St Mary's Church. Many of us have missed the sense of being together in worship and - while there will be considerable restrictions such as no singing and no refreshments - this will be a significant step to restore our 'embodied community'. This new service will be temporary and we will continually adjust and develop the pattern as the situation changes. Our capacity will be considerably reduced so we will use a simple ticketing system. The Gift of Wisdom (Ian Jennings)

it is a moving and dramatic story in 1 Kings chapter 3. In a dream God spoke to Solomon and asked 'What do you want me to do for you?' It was an open invitation to ask God for anything. I wonder what we would have asked for?

Maybe health and strength for ourselves and loved ones, maybe resources enough to be free from worry and to able to give to those in need? I'm sure we could think of worthy things to ask God for but Solomon asked only for wisdom. Actually he requested a 'heart with skill to listen so that I may govern your people justly and distinguish good from evil.' God's response was, 'I grant you your request; I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has been none like you before your time, nor will there be after you.'

We all need wisdom or as the Message Bible puts it, "A God-listening heart." True wisdom begins with the capacity to listen and nothing is more important that having ears tuned to God's voice. Paul wrote to Timothy and said, 'from a child you have known the holy scriptures which are able to make you wise ..' We hear God's voice through his word, through one another, through the stillness of his presence - a discerning heart hears Gods voice. We can develop that sensitivity. If we lack wisdom we can ask God. 'If anyone lacks wisdom let them ask God who gives liberally without reproach - but ask in faith.' (James 1:5)

How does it begin? 'The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom,' (Proverbs 9:10). That does not mean a cringing cowering fear but a deep sense of awe and wonder at the majesty of God. Having a clear vision of the beauty and glory of God is a good beginning - it is the seedbed for the growth of wisdom in our lives.

Because Solomon chose wisdom and not long life and wealth, God said he would receive those things as a kind of by-product. That reminds me of the principle Jesus spelt out in Matthew 6:33 'Seek first the Kingdom if God and his righteousness and everything else will be given to you as well.' When we get our priorities right - God's kingdom and wisdom - everything else finds its rightful place and we have all that we need. God, make us a wise and discerning people.

At Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream by night; and God said, 'Ask what I should give you.'
