Last Sunday Christoph helped us think through the Healthy Habit of Fellowship. We need each other. Because we have a loving Father we also have a loving family. We always need to nurture that sense of close community. For those who were able to attend the 9.30 am service last Sunday - being together at St Mary's again last was joy beyond words. From the 15th March to the 2nd August is a huge gap without Sunday worship in our beautiful building. But the heart-linking relationship of God's family has never ceased and in some ways has grown stronger during this lockdown experience.

My brother in law is in the habit of going to church even when on holiday abroad. He was in Germany and

decided to pop into the local Lutheran Church for worship even though he doesn't speak the language. There was an atmosphere of warmth and friendship and he felt at home even though he understood nothing.

As he listened, he noticed a word that was frequently used which sounded like 'gamineshaft.' In his internal reverie he thought to himself, "That sounds a little bit like 'mineshaft." He continued his internal dialogue and reflected that a mineshaft is something that goes down deep to bring up something precious! It was just a random set of thoughts that slipped into his mind. After the service he asked an English-speaking member of the congregation what the word meant and he was told, 'It means fellowship." He thought to himself 'my thoughts were quite appropriate since fellowship is something that goes down deep to bring up something precious.' And so it it is. God brings us together for purpose. The writer to the Hebrews says, 'Let us consider one another so that we may be stirred to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together.' (Hebrews 10:24-25a) The word consider has the thought of discovery. We can discover something of God in one another, opening our eyes to see Jesus in one another so that we can stir one another to love and good deeds. That quality of fellowship is rich and enriching.

Luke 2. 36-52

There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him. Now every year his parents went to

Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover, And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travellers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.' He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.

This is the gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**
