The Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard by Nnamdi Maduka

It is so easy to define grace as an unmerited favour but what does that mean to us and people around us? In the parable of the vineyard workers, Jesus' story makes no economic sense, and that was his intent. The parable is about coveting, about our frustration with the grace of God as it applies not to us, but to others. We are invited to see ourselves in the story, and then apply it to ourselves. He was giving us a parable about grace, which cannot be calculated like a day's wages. The employer in Jesus' story did not cheat the full-day workers. No, the full -day workers got what they were promised. Their discontent arose from the scandalous mathematics of grace which shows clearly that favour is not a product of labour. They would not accept that their employer had the right to do what he wanted with his money. Christ has prepared a home for all, we all are invited into his place of rest that we do not deserve. None of us gets paid according to merit, none of us is saved by our good works, for none of us comes close to satisfying God's requirements for a perfect life.

Be satisfied with what you have, "godliness with contentment is great gain" (1 Timothy 6:6). Many of us base our self-worth on what we own or achieve. We only feel good about ourselves when we are involved in certain relationships or reach certain goals. It is both scriptural and wise to have goals for your life, but don't undermine yourself by believing that you are 'less than' because you have achieved or acquired less than someone else. The scriptures teach that when you make God's purposes your number one priority, He rewards us based upon the opportunities that He gives us. The only condition to fulfil in order to receive His grace is 'if we can confess with our mouth that Jesus is Lord, and believe in our heart that God raise Him from the death, we will be saved' (Romans 10: 9). It does not matter whether you are a late-comer like the robber crucified with Jesus, a gate-crasher or "the worst of all sinners" (as St Paul described himself in 1 Timothy 1: 15), God has made provision for all of us despite our shortcomings. In His economy it is not rewards that prevail, it is grace that prevails!

So they went. 5 When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. 6 And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, 'Why are you standing here idle all day?' 7 They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard.' 8 When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, 'Call the labourers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first.' 9 When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage. 10 Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual daily wage. 11 And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, 12 saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have

made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' 13 But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? 14 Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. 15 Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?' 16 So the last will be first, and the first will be last."
