Reflections on The Parable of the Wedding by Tom Wright

God is not like a soothing parent, settling children back to sleep after a nightmare. He wants us to be grown-ups, and that includes learning that life isn't like a game of chess where if we do badly we can start again tomorrow. The great, deep mystery of God's forgiveness isn't the same as saying that whatever we do isn't really important because it'll all work out somehow. Of course when Jesus told the parable, it had a particular point and focus: This story is about the coming of God's kingdom, the arrival of the Messiah. Israel's leaders in Jesus' day were like guests invited to a wedding. But they had refused. The Messiah was here but they didn't want to know. Now God was sending out new messengers to the wrong parts of town: prostitutes, riff-raff, nobodies. Good news!

But there is one important point to make: We want to hear is all right exactly as they are. But when the blind and lame came to Jesus, he didn't say, 'You're all right as you are.' He healed them. His love reached people *where* they were but refused to let the prostitutes and extortioners stay *as* they were. Love wants the best for the beloved. Their lives were transformed, healed, changed.

God's kingdom is a kingdom in which love and justice and truth and mercy and holiness reign unhindered. They are the clothes you need to wear for the wedding. And if you refuse to put them on, you are saying that you don't want to stay at the party. That is the reality. If we don't have the courage to say so, we are deceiving ourselves, and everyone who listens to us.

Matthew 22.1-14

He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. while the rest seized his slaves. maltreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet." Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both

good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

'But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God**.
