Render unto Caesar... by Ian Jennings

I picked up a book from my shelf today. It was given to me by my Father-in-law in 1969 so it's a bit battered but still much loved. Out of its pages fell a 100 Lira Turkish bank note. On this old Turkish bank note was a picture of Kemal Atatürk, the Father of the modern Turkish Republic, who died in 1938. On the 100 Lira bill he is wearing a crisp white shirt with a bow tie. He is now almost forgotten, as are his reforms.

When Jesus said, "Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's" he was talking about what is temporary and soon sinks into the dust. When he added, "and unto God the things that are God's," he was speaking about that which never fades, that which is eternal.

They were planning to catch Jesus out again – if he answered the question by saying, "Yes



you should pay your taxes," he would be on the side of Rome. If he said "No don't pay your taxes," he would have been against Rome – either way he would lose – either the people would be angry with him or Rome would be. His answer was not just clever, it was profound. The really important statement here is about rendering to God those things that are God's. What exactly is that? We could talk about our worship, our time, our resources, our love. Yes all of those but, fundamentally, we are to give ourselves. Nothing less is good enough to render to God – God calls for all that we are. Paul writes to the Romans, "Whether we live, we live

unto the Lord. Whether we die we die unto the Lord. Whether we live therefore or die we are the Lord's." (Romans 14.8)

Jim Elliot, who died taking the Gospel to the Huaorani people in Ecuador, wrote, "He is no fool who gives up that which he cannot keep in order to gain what he cannot lose." He rendered to God the things that are God's – himself. That is the only thing that makes sense, as it is the path of unfading joy, both in time and eternity.
