Ever thought of yourself as a Saint? By Nnamdi Maduka

St. Paul often addressed his letters to the saints in a particular church, be it Ephesus, Corinth etc, and that meant **all** the members. So, if he wrote to us today, chances are he would start off by saying something like, *To the saints of the church in Denham*. Ever thought of yourself as a saint? No, me neither. But the tradition of the church tells us we are **all** saints. They are not saints because of what they did but purely because of what Jesus has done for them and for all of us. So, you are a saint, I am a saint, this for sure is not self-righteousness. Our holiness and perfection are hinged on the sacrifice made by Jesus on the Christ. It is no longer us that live, it is Christ that now lives in us. In him we live, move and have our being, without Him we are not able to please him. In the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1–12), the blessings Jesus offered in the Sermon on the Mount, he declared that the qualities and powers of the impending Kingdom of God were available among his followers in such a way that they would bear a distinctive witness to God before the world.

Today we remember those who have gone ahead of us and treasure the gifts they have brought to Christian spirituality over the centuries. All Saints, however, reminds us we are by no means limited to those who have been officially canonized, or those saints who are commemorated on their own individual days in the church calendar. All Saints speaks of those who were not famous, not remembered by everyone, but whose lives and deeds have nonetheless endured. That's not to say for a moment that all these people were perfect. In fact, saints in general have a strong track record not only of being imperfect, but of being decidedly odd! We also remember the saints of the present day, including, incredibly, you and me, in all our diversity, our human-ness and, yes, our oddness as well.

Being a saint is not about unreal piety, or excessive devotion. It's about being essentially human and living with humanity towards one another. Today is a history of **great** saints, to be sure, but it is also the history of **nameless** saints. Dead or alive, the saints can touch our lives every day.

As I survey the long line of the saints who have been formally named in the Church's calendar I find the diversity and variety of people - women and men - breath-taking in its range; all sorts and types and conditions - and therefore tremendously encouraging - a source of hope for us all; we who feebly struggle whilst they in glory shine.
