Worship in the Waiting: Patience

In this Advent season not only do we anticipate the joys of Christmas and the baby in the manger but we also anticipate the coming of Christ, the King of glory. The church has been waiting for 2000 years for this final momentous event and it hasn't happened yet, but Peter reminds us that "God is not slow in keeping his promises, as we understand slowness but he is patient with you." (1 Peter 3:8) The truth is: the moment of his coming will arrive and we need to be ready. God's patience is good news for the world, as Peter puts it, "Bear in mind that our Lord's patience means salvation." (2 Peter 3: 15)

Patience is one of the fruits of the spirit and one we all need. I have a friend who is a pastor and like all those who seek to fulfil a task of Christian ministry he needs patience at times. He has a prayer of the wall of his study which says, "Give me patience Lord - but hurry!" In our waiting for our Lord's return we need to cultivate that stillness of heart and joyous trust that patiently and prayerfully waits for him. There is no point in frustration and agitation in the waiting – 'worship in the waiting' is not just a great Advent title, it is also a great plan. We are all waiting for this promised vaccination to lead us back to health and freedom for our own lives, our families and for our world, but irritation and agitation will not bring it any closer.

The question to ask ourselves during this advent season is "Am I ready to welcome him?" How do I know whether I am ready? Peter talks about making every effort to be "spotless, blameless and at peace with him."

Occasionally for inexplicable reasons my all boys class at school were left alone by our teacher, Mr Marsden. He trusted us to get on with some work but as soon as he disappeared, complete pandemonium broke out. However one boy would keep watch and suddenly announce, "He's coming!" Noise stopped; work resumed and we were ready for his coming. There will be no warning, he will come as a thief, says Peter. In others words: completely unannounced. Here is a little test of our readiness, can we say with all our hearts in the words of the penultimate verse of the Bible, "Even so, Come, Lord Jesus"? *Ian Jennings*

BIBLE READING:2 Peter 3.8-15a

But do not ignore this one fact. beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand vears are like one day. The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed. Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of people ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth. where righteousness is at home. Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation.

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God**.
