# The Baptism of Jesus

In Mark's Gospel the word 'immediately' occurs 42 times. That is more often than the whole of the rest of the New Testament. It's often called the 'urgent Gospel.' Here in the first chapter we read the compelling story of the baptism of Jesus. It is obvious that Jesus did not need a baptism of repentance since had committed no sin - he had nothing of which to repent. But here was the dramatic moment of the beginning of his ministry. Jesus publicly embraces the mission given to him by his Father. Mark wants us to grasp how momentous is this event. He does not just say that the 'heavens opened' but that they were 'torn apart.' The word he uses is 'schizomenous' - a decisive disruption in the status quo. Gods voice disrupts the status quo and announces that Jesus is the 'Beloved Son'. And so it begins ...

Jesus gladly submits to the baptism of John as **an act of identifying** with the people in their movement back to God. John remonstrated with him but Jesus was determined to wholly identify himself with the people he had come to serve. How could he have been effective in his ministry if he stood apart from the people he had come to seek and to save? Harold St John was a fine Victorian young gentleman with a silk hat and frock coat and he felt God's call to the 'down and outs' of London. He took his New Testament and went to preach the Gospel to them. They looked at him in his starched collar and spats and turned their backs.

He prayed and asked God what to do. He put on old and ragged clothes and went and sat among them. He said nothing - he felt their pain, their hunger and their hardships. He lived among them and when he did speak, he spoke with gentleness, love and compassion — and they listened.

The baptism of Jesus was also a moment of equipping - 'the Holy Spirit descended upon him.' The Holy Spirit came 'as a dove.' The dove is the symbol of gentleness. John's ministry was as an 'axe laid to the root of the tree.' It was a radical message of terrible sifting and searching. It was an essential message but with the ministry of Jesus came a new dawn. Full of love and compassion he reached out to the multitudes - he still does. Now he does so through us. Are we ready to embrace the challenge?

## **BIBLE READING:** Mark 1.4-11

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

This is the word of the Lord.

Almighty God, in our baptism you have consecrated us to be temples of your Holy Spirit. May we, whom you have counted worthy, nurture your indwelling Spirit with a lively faith, and worship you with upright lives; through Jesus Christ.
