

Do for a few what you can't do for all

Today we are exploring emotional wellbeing and at times I can get overwhelmed by the demands on me - or the demands *I think* are placed on me. Maybe it's the occupational hazard of a pastor but I know other people who feel similar pressures. Thanks to modern communications we are connected with so many people and often feel we are not doing justice to those relationships. Or we keep in touch on a superficial level (Facebook, annual Christmas cards, the end-of-year round-robin circular letter...), but wish we could deepen our friendships.

In our reading today we meet Jesus at the height of ministry success. There is no let-up as the multitudes follow him, clamouring for his attention (and that's a few years before Facebook was invented!). How does the Son of God deal with the situation?

Jesus goes up on a mountain (space to breathe and think!) and calls to him those whom he wants, in particular the twelve disciples who he will share his life with for the remainder of his earthly life.

Isn't that unfair? What about all the other people who wanted to be part of his inner circle?

Jesus is teaching us an essential lesson here: If we spread ourselves too thinly, the fabric of our souls will eventually tear. Much better to invest in a few central, meaningful relationships than to skim through life, always dissatisfied and exhausted.

Of course Jesus had a bigger plan: These twelve disciples (bar Judas) were meant to continue his ministry after his resurrection and ascension. And that's what they did. How do I know that? Because I am writing this article and you are reading it! Two-thousand years later, the message of Jesus is still ringing round this earth and resonating in Denham.

To stay sane, to be effective, and to leave a lasting legacy, we need to be bold enough to do for a few what we can't do for all.

Who are your few? Some choices will be obvious - people whose care God has entrusted you with such as your family. But there will be others. Are you part of a small group in our church (your church)? This is one of the best investments you can make in your emotional and spiritual wellbeing. *Christoph Lindner*

BIBLE READING: Mark 3:7 - 19

Jesus departed with his disciples to the lake, and a great multitude from Galilee followed him; hearing all that he was doing, they came to him in great numbers from Judea, Jerusalem, Idumea, beyond the Jordan, and the region around Tyre and Sidon. He told his disciples to have a boat ready for him because of the crowd, so that they would not crush him; for he had cured many, so that all who had diseases pressed upon him to touch him. Whenever the unclean spirits saw him, they fell down before him and shouted, 'You are the Son of God!' But he sternly ordered them not to make him known.

He went up the mountain and called to him those whom he wanted, and they came to him. And he appointed twelve, whom he also named apostles, to be with him, and to be sent out to proclaim the message, and to have authority to cast out demons. So he appointed the twelve: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter); James son of Zebedee and John the brother of James (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is, Sons of Thunder); and Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him. Then he went home;
This is the word of the Lord.
