

ALL things come from YOU!

'The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.' (Psalm 24.1) God appointed us as stewards (not owners) who must render our account to Him on how we managed all He entrusted to our care. According to John Stott, the dominion that God gave us is a co-operative and delegated responsibility, intended to express the same sustaining care of the created environment as its creator. Far from exploiting it (which the word *dominion* may sound like) we are to use it in such a way as to be accountable to God and to serve others.

God promised to supply our needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus (Phil. 4.19). Do you have faith and confidence that God can supply all our needs? Our financial wellbeing is hinged on our faith in God which leads to contentment – for Godliness with contentment is great gain (1 Timothy 6:6). Contentment is finding joy in what God has given to you, a Christian grace that grows over time. Paul said, 'I have learn to be content (Philippians 4:12). How did he learn It? Paul understood that Godliness is a God-centred life. It grows through the presence of our source – Jesus Christ. Celebrating the fact that God is the owner of everything and that we are his Stewards is crucial if we are to start enjoying internal freedom from fear and worry. Robert Morris says, 'When you truly deep down, acknowledge that it's all God's anyway, you'll finally experience release from the crushing burden of thinking you have to hoard everything that comes your way.' Remember how people went into panic buying at the beginning of this pandemic? How long did their stuff last? Our financial wellbeing suffers when we turn away from our source and activate our self-help-mode, thinking we can help ourselves.

Sometimes we willingly apply God's message to some areas of our lives but resist applying it to others. For example, we may be open to God about our future but closed concerning how we spend our money. We may respond like good soil to God's demand for worship but respond like rocky soil to give to people in need. To some people, God has no business with their finances, nor what they do on social media etc. God wants us to surrender our lives totally so that we can experience life in its fullness. It is only then that we can say 'all I have needed thy hands has provided, great is your faithfulness, Lord unto me.'
