

Living on Purpose

Denham

This week we are looking at vocational well-being. Our Gospel today references those who dismissed Jesus as 'the carpenter's son.' They passed by the stupendous and saw only the trivial. They failed to see his loving care for the hurting and harassed crowds; they forgot to notice his miracles of healing; they didn't observe that he opened the eyes of the blind, made the deaf hear and the lame walk and preached the Gospel to the poor - they only saw that he was the son of the local carpenter. Jesus said 'I have come to seek and to save the lost.' He had a deep sense of vocation and his whole life was purpose-driven.

This has been a strange year. We have lived with coronavirus for 12 months and some have paid a very high price. We hold in our prayers today all who are hurting. Never was there a more appropriate time for the people of God to reaffirm purpose and the engage with the great mission of reaching out with love and care to a hurting world. Our Denham Parish Church has been doing just that these past twelve months - the doors have been closed but the church has been active.

Dave Smith' writes about his own vocation, "From the moment I accepted Jesus, I remember being filled with not only an overwhelming feeling of love, joy and peace, but also with a deep sense that I was born on purpose and for purpose." That is true for each of us. Pause a moment and let this reality inflame your imagination - you are part of God's great plan - you are here on purpose and for purpose. Our preoccupation with the trivial mustn't rob us of our vision of the truly awesome.

Dennis Healey's biography has a story that focuses on his own sense of vocation. A priest in his constituency said, "Why are you in politics? Is it to make a name for yourself? because that isn't good enough. You need a sense of vocation. You need to direct all your energies and intellect to making a difference; making the world a better place and helping the most needy in society." That advice lived with him.

I am inspired by the people of St Mary's as I observe that so very many of them are not just 'here' but are 'here to make a difference.' We are here on purpose and for purpose — may that inform everything we do. Paul writes, "I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God - this is your true and proper worship" (Romans 12:1). That is a mindset we need every day of our lives.
