BLESSED ARE THE PURE IN HEART (Reflection by John Stott)

It is immediately obvious that the words in heart indicate the kind of purity which Jesus means, as the words 'in spirit' indicated the kind of poverty he meant. The 'poor in spirit' are the spiritually poor as distinct from those whose poverty is only material. From whom, then, are the pure in heart being distinguished?

The popular interpretation is to regard purity of heart as an expression for inward purity, for the quality of those who have been cleansed from moral - as opposed to ceremonial - defilement. And there is good biblical precedent for this, especially in the Psalms. David, conscious that his Lord desired 'truth in the inward being', said, 'you teach me wisdom in the secret heart' and could pray, 'Create in me pure heart, O God.'

Jesus took up this theme in his controversy with the Pharisees and complained about their obsession with external, ceremonial purity: 'you Pharisees clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside you are full of greed and wickedness'.

This emphasis on the inward and moral is certainly consistent with the whole Sermon on the Mount which requires heart-righteousness rather than mere rule-righteousness. Nevertheless, in the context of the other Beatitudes, 'purity of heart' seems to refer in some sense to our relationships. More precisely, the primary reference is to sincerity. In the verses of Psalm 24 the person with 'clean hands and a pure heart' is one 'who does not trust in an idol or swear by a false god'. That is, in their relations with both God and others, people like this are free from falsehood. So the pure in heart are those whose whole life, public and private, is transparent before God and others. Their very heart - including their thoughts and motives - is pure, unmixed with anything devious, under-hand or sordid. Hypocrisy and deceit are repugnant to them; they are without deceit.

Yet how few of us live such a life and live it in the open! We are tempted to wear a different mask and play a different role according to each occasion. This is not reality but play-acting, which is the essence of hypocrisy. Some people weave round themselves such a tissue of lies that they can no longer tell which part of them is real and which is makebelieve. Only Jesus Christ was absolutely pure in heart, being entirely guileless.

Only the pure in heart will see God, see him now with the eye of faith and see his glory in the life of the world to come, for only the utterly sincere can bear the dazzling vision in whose light the darkness of deceit must vanish and by whose fire all pretence is burned up.

SERMON

THE CREED

Through him you have freed us from the slavery of sin, giving him to be born of a woman and to die upon the cross; you raised him from the dead and exalted him to your right hand on high.

Therefore with angels and archangels,

and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks;

he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever.
Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

GIVING OF COMMUNION

At present we receive Holy Communion in one kind (bread) only.

We have devised a one-way system for receiving the bread and then returning to your place through the empty first pew. Please refer to the diagram on page 7 for details and familiarise yourself with your pew number. We are inviting people to come forward by pew number starting with pew No. 1.

Please follow the directions of our sidesteam and keep a distance of two meters to the person in front of you. If you'd like to receive a blessing, please keep you hands at your sides as you come forward. Please walk back to your pew after you receive the wafer and consume it there.

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice.

Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord In the name of Christ. Amen


