Blessed are the peace-makers: Peace rules the day when Christ rules the heart.

Perfect peace is the gift of Christ our Lord. The Prince of Peace came to bring us peace. But our world isn't peaceful – there are religious, ethnic and sectarian divisions everywhere.

The world desperately needs peacemakers today. We need men and women who will stand in the gap, people who will allow peace to begin with them. We cannot give what we do not have. We need the peace that passes all understanding in our lives here and pray to rest in peace when it is time to go home.

The New Testament ministry of peace-making and peace-keeping requires the active involvement of a third-party to step between contentious people to restore God's peace. Peace-making is therefore costly in time, effort and emotional strain. It calls for a self-sacrificial involvement in situations of strife and tension.

To some people, Jesus' teachings are an impossible dream. Others see his Sermon on the Mount as the heavenly blueprint for peace-making in the world today. Some Christian organisations are experimenting with alternative ways of rehabilitating criminals. They are demonstrating a true ministry of peace-making through reconciliation. Their victim - offender reconciliation programme serves as a go-between. It brings victims and offenders together to pave the way for offenders to make some measure of restitution for a crime and seek reconciliation with the victim. Through such initiatives citizens of God's kingdom are being used to bring an end to problems such as social injustice an inner-city deprivation.

Reflecting on Mathew 5:7, Bishop Steven writes that peace or *shalom* is more than the absence of conflict. Shalom means wholeness and well-being and fulfilment and reconciliation. Jesus himself came to make peace and effect reconciliation, to break down barriers and create a single new humanity (Ephesians 2:17)

The church like Jesus is called to a ministry of reconciliation. This begins with offering and receiving forgiveness within the Christian community. But we are also called to be peacemakers and reconcilers within our wider society, between generations, in families torn by strife, in divided communities and in God's wider world.

In whatever situation we find ourselves, there is perfect peace to be found in Jesus. This peace is incomparable, indescribable and full of meaning, we all need it, ask for it today! It is available for those who desire it! *Nnamdi Maduka*
