A Prophet in His Own Town, by Tom Wright

Jesus' message was different. He wasn't just another synagogue preacher, telling people how to obey God's law, offering God's hope for the future, explaining from the prophets something about when the kingdom might come. He was saying, apparently on his own authority, that the kingdom was coming, then and there. Where he was, the kingdom of God was. And if there was any doubt on the matter, he was doing things that demonstrated it.

But in Nazareth – his hometown – there was doubt. This is the odd thing. They had heard what he'd done in Capernaum and around the lakeshore; now they were teasing, mocking, challenging him to do the same back home where everyone knew him. I think, though, that there was more to it than just putting the 'local boy made good' in his place. The kind of kingdom Jesus was talking about was not the sort of kingdom his contemporaries wanted to hear about. They didn't need to believe such a dangerous message; they could dismiss it as 'Oh, he's just the local handyman. We know his brothers!'

There may be hidden irony here: Jesus is indeed the one who can fix things, the one who is putting up a building, the one people should go to to get things sorted out.

And one of his brothers, James, later became the great leader in the Jerusalem church. It's good to be reminded that at this stage he was simply a puzzled, and perhaps angry, younger brother.

Christians today need to keep in mind both the big picture of what God is doing in our world and our time, and the many smaller pictures of the individual humans, perhaps at the moment in rebellion against the gospel, who by God's grace will become people of faith and prayer.
