

We are called to serve...



Growing hearts of service within the body of Christ is inherently biblical, but also a practical necessity to sustain our church.

WHY WE MUST GROW SERVANT HEARTS HERE IN DENHAM

IT'S INHERENTLY BIBLICAL

- Jesus: the ultimate example of servant leadership.
- (Read Philippians 2.5-11).
- The Apostle Paul is clear that:
 - We must seek to "build up the body of Christ" (Ephesians 4:11-13).
 - We are one body, but all have different,
 complementary, God-given gifts to allow this
 body to live and breathe (Romans 12:4-8).
- Service is central to enable the church to fulfil its mission of outreach and support of others in the love of Christ. Without it, we see decline.

IT'S A PRACTICAL NECESSITY

- Pray, Welcome, Share, Dare: we have a mission in Denham that cannot be fulfilled without us coming together as a church family. New initiatives can only be launched once a team has been formed.
- We need 15-20 volunteer roles just to run our church services every Sunday (excluding other areas of ministry).
- A subset of our congregation are "multiple hatting", risking the future sustainability of our ministry:
 - Overload and burnout;
 - Gaps in key roles / succession planning;
 - Low capacity to plan and think ahead.
- A church where many members are actively involved is resilient at times of change and transition (e.g. vacancy between rectors).

Therefore, we need to refocus how we best serve each other and our church family in the name of Jesus.

The benefits of volunteering

Volunteering supports the church we serve, but also helps us grow as individuals.

BRINGS US CLOSER TO GOD Taking a next step on your journey of faith, and how you engage with God.

HELPS THE COMMUNITY

Providing a sense of helping those who need it, both in our church family and in the wider parish.

INCREASES SELF CONFIDENCE

Providing the chance to try something new and feel a sense of impact and achievement whilst doing it.

BUILDS SKILLS

Providing an opportunity to learn a practical skill that you didn't use previously, for the benefit of others.

INSTILS A SENSE OF PURPOSE

Helping to feel like you are making an impact in a different way in your daily life.

Providing an opportunity to engage in an activity that supplements your physical or mental growth.

Supporting our volunteers



We are seeking to nurture a culture around volunteering that equips, encourages and supports those who serve in our church – where we can all feel we are working to help a bigger purpose. We will...

BE TRANSPARENT



A volunteer role is not for life! We will always be clear about what the role is, the time commitment involved, and set a target point for review to enable you to continue, try something new, or step back from the role.

EQUIP



We will ensure volunteers are **prepared and able to fulfil their role** through providing the appropriate training, learning of new skills, shadowing and support.

ENGAGE



We will **listen to feedback** from those in volunteer roles, and use these to help continuously improve how we deliver our ministry at St. Mary's.

VALUE



Nothing is taken for granted! We will recognise those who support the church in a variety of ways (e.g. thank you's on a Sunday, at the APCM, within the ministry team, etc.).

SUPPORT



We will work together: nobody will be left on their own to carry out a role, unless they are comfortable doing so. There will always be a point of contact to ask questions or raise any concerns.

SIMPLIFY



Volunteering shouldn't be made difficult: **we will minimise bureaucracy** and admin wherever possible.

So, how can I help?



HOW CAN I HELP?

1.

Read through our volunteering catalogue to gain an understanding of:

- All the volunteer roles required across St. Mary's
- Where there are volunteer vacancies, or where additional support is required

2. Prayerfully consider the theme of growing hearts of service in Denham

- Are there any volunteer roles that particularly leap out as something you might be able to help with?
- If you currently volunteer, are there any changes you feel God is calling you towards?

Get in touch with the listed ministry leader, our churchwardens or Christoph if you want to discuss any further, or feel you can step into any of the roles we need. Many ministries offer a "first serve" to get a taster, and you can trial your involvement for most roles on an informal basis.

Priority roles to fill

#

We have categorised all of our volunteering roles into one of three categories, to help us prioritise where we need the most support.

1. CURRENT ROLE VACANCIES

- There are currently no volunteers occupying the role.
- Clergy may drive a minimal element of support for the role.
- Without a forthcoming volunteer, we will be unable to sustain the ministry, to (re-)start this activity or to grow it.

Examples:

- Café Church Hospitality Lead and Team
- Vestry Tea Co-ordinator and hosts
- Family Ministry Administrator
- Prayer Ministry Lead and Team
- Church Houses Manager
- Fundraising support
- St Mark's Committee secretary

2. ADDITIONAL SUPPORT REQUIRED

- There is a small number of volunteers occupying the role.
- The amount of work required for the role stretches the capacity of the volunteers currently assigned.
- Additional support to the existing volunteers is required to make the ministry or service sustainable.

Examples:

- Sunday Club leaders & helpers
- Forest Church team members
- Welcomers
- Coffee team
- Magazine distributors
- Camera and sound operators
- Pastoral care assistants
- Bookkeeper & Gift Aid Co-ordinator
- Magazine distributors
- Service moderators (online)

3. WELL RESOURCED FOR NOW

- There are enough volunteers assigned to the role to perform the ministry or service in a sustainable way.
- No additional volunteers are required at this time.
 However, please express an interest if you would still like to help - there is a space for you!

Examples:

- Readers
- Fabric team
- Intercessors
- Flower arrangers
