# FIRST READING: 2 Samuel 18.5-9, 15, 31-33

## SERMON

#### THE CREED

We believe in one God. the Father, the Almighty. maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord. Jesus Christ, the only Son of God. eternally begotten of the Father.
